The correct number of total credits for Utah is 24.0, and the national average is 21.0.

- 2. Beginning with the graduating class of 2012, Rhode Island will require all school districts to use students' results on statewide assessments as part of graduation determinations. Students will not be prohibited
- from graduating based solely on assessment results. 3. Subject-specific credits for states that do not have total course-credit requirements are not listed in the total-credits column and are not reflected in the national average for total credit requirements.

- 4. Students must pass either the science or social studies components of the Graduation Exit Examination (GEE) to receive a standard diploma.
- 5. For the graduating classes of 2010 through 2014, students in Minnesota can graduate by passing statewide reading and writing assessments and either passing mathematics assessments or meeting other
- 6. To receive the standard diploma, students must earn at least six verified credits by passing end-of-course assessments. One of those credits may be earned by passing a student-selected test in computer science,
- technology, career and technical education, or other areas.
- 7. For the graduating class of 2010, students must pass an exit exam in reading and writing. Students in the class of 2013 will be required to pass reading, writing, math, and science assessments.
